SITE MAINTENANCE CODE

**For maintenance and refurbishment work across
the whole of Didcot Railway Centre**

ORDER OF PRIORITIES –assuming unrestricted skills
in the maintenance team.

Routine/essential

- 1 Toilets, refreshment rooms, paths, signs,
site plant** - sweeping/cleaning/light repairs.
- 2 Grass, trees, shrubs and materials** -
cutting/pruning/leaf and debris
clearance/storage.
- 3 Buildings** - slates/roofsheet/glazing/gutter/
downpipe repairs.
- 4 Track** - keys/fishplates/packing/alignment
attention.
- 5 Buildings** – repainting work.

Heavy/intermittent

Buildings – cladding/masonry/drainage repairs.

Track – drainage/spot re-sleeping works.

Minor new works

– small scale additions or improvements.
